### **Type of submissions**

- ❖ Short written pieces (about 500-800 words with longer pieces to be discussed with the editor).
- ❖ Original poems accompanied by a short bio of the poet.
- ❖ Original songs accompanied by a short bio of the writer.
- ❖ Original artwork accompanied by a short bio of the artist.
- ❖ Original photos accompanied by a short bio of the artist.
- ❖ Different types of submissions to be discussed with the editor.

### **Focus**

- ❖ Any topic relevant to health/medical humanities such as, but not limited to, the following: re-humanising healthcare, bioethics, art interweaved with science or healthcare, humanities interweaved with science or healthcare, links between nature and science or healthcare, etc.
- ❖ Please get in touch with the editor, if you are unsure about your topic.

### **Submission Checklist**

- ❖ Include the name/alias that you would like to see accompany your submission.
- ❖ Seek written permission for use of any copyrighted images/quotes, etc. and attach these with your submitted post.
- ❖ Citations can either be in Vancouver or Harvard style.
- ❖ Use editable file formats, such as doc., docx, etc.
- ❖ We recommended language that a general audience will understand.
- ❖ Finalise your work as you would like to see it published and submit at [Ourania.varsou@glasgow.ac.uk](mailto:Ourania.varsou@glasgow.ac.uk).
- ❖ If artificial intelligence software has been used for your work, please provide a brief description with your submitted post.
- ❖ Optional: Include your title, preferred pronouns, job title, affiliation(s) or social media links.
